Parent's or Guardian's Informed Permission Form
PLEASE READ CAREFULLY BEFORE SIGNING

A first-hand experience with laboratory procedures is an important part of many courses in psychology. At NYU, we take advantage of our faculty's active research programs to give students that experience. Students in most courses participate in carefully supervised studies, thus gaining otherwise unobtainable experience with original research in psychology.

We have both department and university-wide committees that approve studies for our students. These committees are very exacting in enforcing high ethical standards. Each of the research projects contains safeguards designed to protect the rights and welfare of the students who participate. All records are confidential, so the privacy of the student's data is protected.

The Study: Your child, _____, is invited to take part in a study named Predicting Others' Feelings. It is being conducted by Ido Liviatan who is the principal investigator. Its Purpose: The study is designed to learn more about the various factors that determine people's judgments of others' experiences.

Its Procedures: If you give permission for your child to be in this study, he or she will be asked to read descriptions of others' behaviors and judge their experience of it. Participation will take about 1 hour, for which your child will receive 1 hour of credit.

Its Risks: There are no known risks associated with this study.

Its Benefits: Although your child will receive no direct benefits for participation in this study, it may make your child more aware of how knowledge is discovered in psychology and help the investigator better understand factors that affect people's social judgments.

Consent: Participation in this study is completely voluntary. Non-participation or withdrawal will not affect your child's grade or academic standing in any way. Further, once participating, he or she may withdraw at any time and still receive any credit offered in exchange for that participation.

Privacy: Confidentiality of your child's research records will be strictly maintained by the assignment of codes not identifiable with real names. Materials will be kept in a locked laboratory room accessible only by the researchers. These materials will be maintained for 5 years, and then be shredded, as recommended by the American Psychological Association.

Debriefing: On completing the study your child will receive a thorough written explanation of it that you may ask to see.

The information above has satisfied me such that I agree that my child may participate in your study.
